- 4. The genus that contains over 150 named species and subspecies
- 7. The tell-tale sign of a crayfish burrow
- 10. A species in danger of extinction throughout all or a significant portion of its range
- 14. An animal with jointed appendages and segmented body
- 17. The order in which crayfish belong, literally means "10 legs"
- 21. Found only in a certain area
- 22. The terminal claw of the most anterior pair of legs extending from beneath the carapace; also called chelae
- 24. Genus that contains the highest number of crayfish species in Missouri
- 26. The reproductively active form of male crayfish
- 29. Regional name for crayfish

- 34. A pocket-like, raised structure located on the underside of female crayfish between the bases of the last two pair of walking legs

- 37. Genus of small crayfish where gonopods look like crossed sabers
- 38. The appendages on the first five segments on the abdomen of a crayfish. In males the first pair are modified into gonopods. In females, are where the eggs attach
- 39. Hourglass-shaped area situated along the midline of the carapace between the cervical groove and abdomen
- 41. Flowing water habitat for crayfish

- 2. The outer skin of crayfish and other arthropods; is an external skeleton. Composed primarily of chitin
- 3. Any of various freshwater crustaceans of the genera Cambarus and Astacus, resembling a lobster but considerably smaller
- 5. Regional term for "crayfish"
- A species likely to become endangered throughout all or a significant portion of its range
- 8. What biologists refer to crayfish as because they feed on many trophic levels
- 9. A shallow depression on the ventral surface of the sperm receptacle in female crayfish
- 11. Posterior, externally segmented part of the crayfish body
- 12. The dome-shaped, unsegmented shell covering the anterior half of the body
- 13. The terminal end of the chelipeds; claw or pincer
- 15. Genus of dwarf crayfishes Latin meaning "small crustacean"
- 16. The study of crayfish
- 18. How crayfish breath
- 19. The most critical event in the life of an individual crayfish, used for growth and for changing to and from the reproductive form
- 20. A triangular-shaped anterior extension of the carapace, located dorsally between the eyes
- 23. The material comprising the rigid exoskeleton or shell of crayfish
- 25. A dark transverse band present on the carapace in some crayfish. Typically, occur near the cervical groove and near the junction of the carapace and abdomen
- 27. The flattened posterior section of the abdomen in crayfish, also called the tail fan
- 28. The longer of two sets of paired, segmented appendages of the head
- 30. What the female is called when carrying eggs
- 31. In Missouri, if you have this, there are probably crayfish
- 32. Feeding on many trophic levels
- 35. A pair of structures extending forward between the bases of the walking legs from their point of attachment to the ventral surface of the first abdominal segment in male crayfish
- 39. The narrow, spine-like forward extension of the rostrum
- 40. Still-water habitat for crayfish
