WQMC (Notes from the August meeting can be found: http://www.mywaterquality.ca.gov/monitoring_council/meetings/2013aug/notes_082813.pdf) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Ocean Ecosystem Health Metrics program will be interviewing for someone to examine whether the health of reefs is more affected by fishing pressure or water quality. b. Ocean Ecosystem Health Workgroup Roadmap effort is being developed to discuss leadership support and funding of the portal. c. The Safe to Drink Portal will be presented to the Monitoring Council in December. d. SWRCB Clean Water Act Integrated Report will be released soon and “readily available data” will be defined as data available in CEDEN. Data solicitations will now be continuous, and reports will cover three regions at a time, rotating among the nine regions during each round of assessments. e. The California Water Plan, Sustainability Indicators Framework was presented by Abdul Khan (DWR). Presentation covered the developed multi-metric (economic, environmental, social) analysis to gauge the health of CA Watersheds; analysis aimed to identify healthy watersheds that are vulnerable to environmental and human induced factors. f. Estuary Portal Beta version was presented and approved for public release, pending more detailed review. g. Rocky Intertidal Portal has been approved for release. h. Discussion with the Delta Science Program staff indicated there is a clear nexus of the goals of the Delta Science Plan and the Monitoring Council, hopes for ongoing discussion and coordination on how the two groups can pursue their mutual objectives. i. Triennial Audit will be developed by Jon Marshack and Kris Jones in place of the next annual report. j. December 12th is the next WQMC Meeting. 2. CA Wetlands- future meetings will focus on providing scientific defensible extent of

	<p>wetland and the change over time, in hopes of answering the Governor’s directive of no net loss of wetlands.</p> <p>3. Healthy Streams Portal is working with EPA on the CA Healthy Watershed Initiative. A second draft of the report will be released in mid-October.</p> <p>4. Data Management team will have their next meeting on October 2nd. They will be discussing the data set wish-lists we provided then.</p>

Notes:	<p>Stephanie Fong gave a brief overview of the beta portal and announced that approval to link to the Water Quality Conditions Interactive report will go live with links from portal. Links to the report will be in a new section on the “Monitoring” page and as link on the “Why is Water Quality a Key Attribute” page.</p> <p>A few formatting concerns need to be worked out before launch. Some inconsistency in page layout should be addressed. The subheadings need to be more apparent, either highlighted or in a color other than black. The workgroup brought up that on mobile devices, scrolling side to side does not function correctly.</p> <p>Jon Marshack will ask State Board Staff to add an “about us” button to the left navigation panel that links to the Estuary Workgroup webpage.</p> <p>Text edits will be handled by a small group (Hildie Spautz, Kris Jones, Bill Templin and Kristal Fadke). And will work with 34 North to address comments made at this meeting and at the WQMC meeting.</p> <p>The Beta Version will be made available to the WQMC on October 7th, and ask that their comments be in by October 18th.</p>
