<p>Notes:</p>	<p>2.1 CWQMC Subgroups</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Portal Development: Subcommittee meeting on 2/13/18 discussed the Council’s initial guidance on having question driven navigation. One goal that was discussed is developing content that is generally accessible, flexible, and good for agencies and the public while meeting the needs of government programs. Another goal is getting more people involved in portal content. Lastly, they want to figure out how to get portals to benefit from each other and blend content where appropriate as some content will cross multiple groups. Any comments and feedback to be directed to Kris Jones and Sarah Lesmeister. b. The CA Wetland Monitoring Workgroup (CWMW) developed a business plan to ensure long-term sustainability for their tool sets that utilize premium services for training, customer service, and funding. Kris highlighted that the CEMW would be able to learn from the CWMW’s efforts, as the CEMW has experienced similar challenges regarding the long-term funding for the Estuaries Portal. c. The Monitoring Council formed a new Environmental Flows workgroup, which will focus on improved coordination of technical approaches for the development and implementation of environmental flows in California. Their first meeting is February 27th in the Resources building, and will include specific state partners to further develop the scope and goals for the workgroup. Future meetings will then broaden to include other additional participants. Contact Kris Jones if you are interested in joining, or add your name to the Environmental Flow Workgroup’s lyrics list. <p>2.2 CEMW Subgroups</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. The Portal subgroup is looking to shift to quarterly meetings or as needed. The portal launch is set to coincide with the IEP workshop March 6-8th. Kris Jones will be giving a lightning round talk (5-minute talk) at the IEP workshop about the portal.

	<p>b. Water Quality and Quantity meeting had many questions on the portal. It was decided that any substantial comments on the survey will be worked through and changes can be made as they go.</p> <p>c. Living Resource Subcommittee is in a final review process for the portal content.</p> <p>d. Strategic Planning created a draft factsheet to share with the CEMW as a tool for both outreach and education and will be distributed at the IEP workshop.</p>

	<p>public release. February 23rd is the deadline to submit the survey for the Estuary Portal’s review. Depending on survey responses and the CWQMC decision, the CEMW portal subcommittee may hold a meeting before the launch (February 23rd deadline-March 6th IEP Workshop) to address major red flags. Any minor improvements can be made over the next several months and should not interfere with launch.</p> <p>Some improvements that were discussed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Home Page navigation needs to be more cohesive • Home Page could be improved to clarify content and data sources. • Members of the CEMW liked the current URL (Californiaestuaryportal.com) and questioned the permanency of the URL. • Members wanted a mention or link to Real Time Monitoring data AND QA’d data (ex: QA’d data from CDEC). • The survey would not allow uploading screen shots or pictures. Instead email them to Karly@34North.com and include Sarah Lesmeister and Kris Jones. • The numbers in some graphs have spaces between them, making the data unclear. • Links/dots in the station map seem glitchy – green dots give correct information but if it stays blue it gives incorrect information. • Unclear as to what the “popular topics” mean on the home page.

Notes:	<p>There were many questions and comments about the draft factsheet with the main one being that the goals of the fact sheet were not clearly defined. Some members thought that we should be promoting the product (the portal) while others thought we should be recruiting partners to the CEMW. Sarah has noted all comments and will be sharing another draft of the factsheet before IEP. Due to limited time, CEMW members agreed to two days to provide feedback on the draft factsheet.</p> <p>Some improvements that were discussed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The last paragraph should be first to emphasize that the goal is to seek additional partners “JOIN US!” • The factsheet should be double sided to allow for better visualizations • The current imagery is ineffective and hard to see. Larger or different pictures should be used. • More specific information was requested such as specific agencies/programs involved and the geographic scope
