- AB 1066 was sign by the governor on October 8, 2021. This bill would require, on or before July 1, 2022, the (California Water Quality Monitoring) council to direct a new or existing working group to study water recreation hazards at priority water-contact recreation sites, as specified. The bill would require, on or before July 1, 2023, the working group to submit a report to the council that the council would be required to post on its internet website that includes specified information. Luke Ginger will provide us a summary on this recent recreational water quality monitoring bill.
