


Summary of SF Regional Board Comments

- Confusion between "functional capacity" and "condition"
- Clarify definition of project relative to Regional Board programs
- Disagree with several stated appropriate uses
 - Design and monitoring of riverine wetlands restoration projects
 - Evaluation of Beneficial Uses

- Evaluation of impacts associated with unauthorized (enforcement) actions
- Assessment of Mitigation Compliance.
- Comparison of proposed alternatives,

Summary of SF Regional Board Comments (cont.)

- Suggest that some stream types not be referred to as "wetland"
- Some Water Board staff are not convinced that CRAM has passed the appropriate peer reviews for application in riverine systems"



Summary of Corps of Engineers Comments

- Concern over use of term wetlands for some types of riverine (e.g. ephemeral streams)
- Clarify that CRAM is appropriate for consideration of mitigation ratios and performance standards – one of the preferred uses
 - NOTE conflicts with Regional Board 2 recommendation



Next Steps (recommended)

- Meet with Regional Board 2 staff to discuss concerns
 - September 10, 2009
- Final revisions to Technical Bulletin
 - NOTE cannot address all agency concerns
 - Goal = balanced, technically sound document
 - Non-binding for agencies

- Aid in CRAM implementation
- Produce Technical Bulletin as a "CWMW product" and post to the web
